Message from Bethlehem's Executive Director

This is the year to tackle the issue of affordable housing!

Safe, secure and affordable housing is the first key factor that determines an individual's or family's social well-being and health. When families have safe affordable housing along with the right supports, they can start to pave the way forward through a crisis and focus on what they need to do to improve their lives. In our annual campaign letter, you will read the story of Tatiana's life – it is not an easy one - but it is a story of hope. Her journey began with a home, supports, connections to services and setting goals to rebuild and become healthy. Also in this letter and on our website you will read about some examples of the many support programs that assisted Tatiana and her family.

There are others like her, which due to personal challenges or trauma, led to a life of poverty and a risk of becoming homeless. In Niagara there are approximately *6,000 households on the affordable housing wait list* and at any one time over the past few years between 276 and 589 can be identified as a risk priority that includes homeless, becoming homeless and/or victims of domestic violence. *In Niagara 14% of the population (60,390 households) is struggling with a low income under the poverty line*, and 44% of rental households are paying more than 30% of their income on rent. These individuals and families are at risk, and improving their chances starts with access to affordable housing. Improving the housing affordability for struggling families will positively impact the Niagara Region economy from which we all benefit. If we don't, the cost to the community and local economy will continue to rise.

Bethlehem Housing has the experience and proven capacity to provide successful affordable supportive housing solutions. As a Housing and Support Services organization, we have an unequivocal duty and responsibility to respond to this very important issue. Our new strategic plan for the next three to five years includes a leadership role and strategies to expand the affordable housing stock in the Niagara Region.

With your help, we will have the ability to enable resources, build partnerships and solve the affordable housing crisis in our Niagara communities. **Everyone in Niagara deserves to have a stable, affordable place to call** *Home***. Join us in the crusade to build affordable housing!**
