## HERE IS MIGUEL'S STORY ...

For many years I struggled with drug addiction. I was in and out of several rehabs, support groups, and 12 step communities. I was not able to maintain long term abstinence from drugs. I have worked in the gaming industry for a very long time but suffered from a brain injury and found myself off work during the pandemic. My world crashed down. I had just left a long-term relationship and was struggling to cope with life as a single father with custody of a beautiful child.

Growing up in an unhealthy environment full of emotional and physical abuse, I continued to struggle. I decided to seek childhood trauma therapy to deal with my past issues as it was a recurring theme in my addiction. It was the best decision I made in my life. I started the journey to show my son a way out as he was dealing with issues of abandonment and abuse while he lived with his mother.

#### LOOKING FORWARD TO WHAT'S NEXT, EVOKING OPPORTUNITY AND NEW COLLABORATIONS

My clean date is October 26, 2020. I stopped using during the pandemic and turned to zoom meetings for support. I reached out to Bethlehem Place and met with a support worker that treated me with kindness, compassion, and empathy. We worked together over the next couple of months with the goal of moving into Bethlehem Place. I continued to work with my support worker with the hopes of getting into Bethlehem Place and one day they called and let me know we could move in. It was probably one of the best days I had in a long time. I embraced the opportunity and became a willing participant in all the courses and classes that are offered to all tenants.

#### These were perfect for me as I'm learning how to live all over again...

On this journey I am a person that has embraced the place of discomfort in many areas of my life as it's shown me how to challenge and motivate myself. My son and I are 5 months into our stay here at Bethlehem Place and our life has changed 1000%. Recently I've facilitated a couple of rehab aftercare meetings for clients locally and love sharing my experience, strength, and hope with others. Bethlehem Place provides my son with after school snacks and crafts, and he feels included here. I am currently taking my teacher's training course for yoga and reiki healing.



This year has been the best year of my life spiritually, emotionally, and physically. I recently celebrated 1 year clean and with all the opportunities gifted me this year it has made our lives full of love and kindness. I have made some new friends in recovery and have stepped into the best version of myself. My son and I are worthy of a healthy life today. I truly am so blessed to have a fresh start at life, and I can't thank Bethlehem Place and all the staff enough for this great opportunity. Blessings to All - Miguel

## COMMUNITY GARDEN IN THE PLAYGROUND

We plant an edible garden for the children to watch, grow and eat while enjoying the outdoors. We plant strawberries, cucumbers, cherry tomatoes, beans & lettuce. This garden offers a wide range of benefits for children, supporting their physical, emotional, social, and educational development.

**Hands on Learning** - plant life cycles, weather, ecosystems and sustainability. Nutrition Awareness - by growing fruits and vegetables, kids gain a better understanding of healthy eating and where food comes from.

**Physical Activity** - children outside and moving - digging, planting, watering, and weeding involve physical effort, which promotes fitness and motor skills.

Mental and Emotional Health - gardening has calming, therapeutic effects.

**Sense of Community and Belonging** - Being a part of a community garden helps children build relationships with peers and adults , fostering a strong sense of inclusion and connectedness.

Community gardens are not just green spaces- they're living classrooms that nurture the whole child and contribute to stronger healthier communities.

## Navigating Niagara's Changing Housing Realities

In response to Niagara's growing need for safe, affordable housing and wraparound support, Bethlehem Housing and Support Services has **housed over 2,500 families since 1988** — many of whom arrived in crisis. At intake, 73% of our residents were homeless, and more than half were survivors of domestic violence. Today, **267 households live in our permanent supportive housing**, including 17% who are low-income working families striving to maintain stability.

Our programs are built to address complex needs, with 37% of clients managing physical or mental health disabilities. Through 175 social and recreational activities, 1,324 child visit to our EarlyOn Centre, and nearly 6,100 pounds of food distributed via our fresh food markets – accessed annually by 958

households — we foster personal growth, resilience, and self-sufficiency. Remarkably, 66% of those who exited supportive **housing transitioned into secure, independent living** – a testament to the power of compassionate, community-based care.
